Dr. Joanna Perdomo is a native of Miami, Florida and a practicing primary care pediatrician at Nicklaus Children's Hospital. Dr. Perdomo has been an active member of the AAP since the start of residency, first through the Massachusetts Chapter and now the Florida Chapter. She serves on the Florida Chapter's Equity, Diversity & Inclusion Committee and Residency Advocacy Curriculum Task Force and is a member of the national Sections on Minority Health Equity & Inclusion and Early Career Physicians. From 2020–2022, she participated in the national AAP's Young Physicians Leadership Alliance and in 2023 received a CATCH grant to launch a successful after-school nutrition education program in South Florida.
